

### Adverse Weather Activities for P4-7 pupils

Read a book for 15 minutes a day. Note down any words you do not know and find out their meaning.	Sketch what you see when you look out of a window in your house.	If you are outside and build a snowman, measure the height and width of it. Compare the size of your snowman with others.	Ask a family member to quiz you on your times tables.	Choose a character from a favourite book and imagine what they would do if they were stuck indoors on a snowy day.
Follow instructions to prepare a healthy meal for your family.	Learn or create a short song or rap.	Try to do 5 things to help someone else.	Put out some food for the birds and observe what wildlife it attracts.	Go for a shape hunt in the snow. Can you spot any shapes you haven't noticed before?
Draw and colour a symmetrical pattern or picture.	Track your 5-a-day fruit and vegetables.	Play a board game, dominoes, snap or invent your own fun board game.	Watch Newsround and discuss what you learn with a friend or family member.	Make up a general knowledge quiz for your family.
Research 5 new facts relating to your topic.	Build an obstacle course (inside or outside) with parental permission.	How many snowballs can you build and throw in 1 minute?	Find out interesting facts about your family history.	Design a perfect outfit or vehicle for the snowy weather.
Write your name or spelling words in the snow.	Record yourself spelling out your spelling words. Can you get faster each time?	Note down the temperature at the same time every day. Record the results in a creative way. E.g. graph	Review a TV programme or film you have watched today.	Design a new cover for your reading book.
